he Visual Media Association (VMA) is dedicated to preserving the heritage of the paper and print industry through a centralized

collection of valuable books. artwork. historical records and photography. Donated by VMA members spanning 141 years of history, these 120 titles have been gathered from across Australia due to office closures and staff relocations which have now all been collated together under the Association roof once more

The collection encompasses printing, bookmaking, and typography, featuring renowned printers, publishers, and designers. Additionally, it includes

artwork and imagery that provide crucial insights into the industry's evolution, making it a significant cultural and financial asset for the Association and the broader industry. Highlights range from historical photographs capturing early 20th-century Boards and Industry Leader Committees to Workers operating printing presses in the 1920s, honor boards listing former Presidents dating back to the late 1800s and Minutes fro the original Association meetings. With an appraised value of approximately \$40,000, the collection boasts titles dating as far back as 1522 and the esteemed and rare Guternberg Bible.



Valuable Typesetting Manuals

Further among the valuable contributions are typesetting manuals, offering guidance on typography, print techniques, and design. These manuals have long been cherished resources for printers, providing practical advantages and cultural insights. For instance, "The Printers Grammar" by C. Stower provides a concise history of printing advancements from 1758 to its publication in 1808. Another notable manual is "An Essay of Typography" by Eric Gill, the font designer renowned for creating Gill Sans. Published in 1931, the book explores typography's cultural significance at the time and celebrates craftsmanship during the industrial age.

The famous Gutenberg Bible

One title that epitomizes the collection's cultural significance is the "Biblia Sacra Mazarinea II". It comprises of a two-volume facsimile of the original Gutenberg Biblethe renowned and historically significant Bible printed by Johannes Gutenberg using movable-type printing press between 1454 and 1455. Gutenberg's invention revolutionized the Western print industry, marking the advent of the "Information Age" by enabling mass production and the dissemination of ideas and knowledge. The facsimile in VMA's possession, a masterpiece known for its Gothic type and fine printing, is invaluable since only forty-



eight (48) substantial original copies are known to exist today.

The collection extends beyond the realm of paper and print, delving into the arts and our history. The oldest book in the VMA collection, "Plauti Comoediae", published in 1522, contains plays by Titus Maccius Plautus, a renowned Roman playwright from the 3rd century BCE. A popular figure during the Roman Republic, Plautus' works offer valuable insights into Roman literature and culture, making this Renaissance-era book a precious source for those interested in the era.
